The land was tiered off and a bunch of metal chairs were moved in and out of the sun as the ladies decided if having a tan was more important than cooling off.

Anchor was a lot stricter on their guest policy back then also. You could not have more than two families with you on any given day. No other guests. And every guest we brought onto the grounds had to be recorded each day in the guest log-book in the clubhouse. It seems like something more likely in this day and age of insurance concerns and litigation.

There were showers in the basement that were pretty nasty and seldom used. They are now utilized as storage for the club. A set of steps went up the back of clubhouse leading to a small porch with a service window that opened to the back of the old bar. You could ring a bell and if you were lucky someone at the bar would come and sell you a soda.


This was better than the alternative... walking into the clubhouse as child was a little intimidating. God forbid you happened to have a wet swimming suit and would drip a little. I was probably 20 years old before I stopped being scared of Joe Teer Sr. and Joe Krebs!

When I moved from being a son of a member to a member, one of my first jobs was to take water samples from the swimming area. Samples were then delivered to Memorial Hospital's labs. Results were sent out the next week. But by this time, people were not using the beach much anymore. A few years later (I believe it was 2002) the Leptospirosis threat came to the lake and that pretty much sealed the fate of the swimming area.

Thanks for the comments on last month's article on the greatest Anchor boats. A few members have asked me to write a little more on Anchor's history, at least my recollection of it. So this month I thought I would talk about the Anchor swimming area.



First of all, yes, Anchor had a swimming area! It was the cove between us and Sangamo Surf. A forty-foot dock ran along our side with a ladder on each end. There was a sandy beach with a retaining wall around it (you can still see some of that wall). There was a floating dock that was usually completely covered with duck droppings. In my younger days we did not have a goose problem but did have an overabundance of ducks. And the pride of the swimming area was a great diving board. It was aluminum and built to last. It was particularly effective for those of us with a little extra weight.
